LT. DET. MERNER: Just put your name in there that we've advised you of your opportunity to have this interview electronically recorded, which is audiotape which is on the machine there, by the Boston Police Department, and it's whether or not you agree. MS. MCALLISTER: What's the date?

LT. DET. MERNER: The date today is April the 20th.

SGT. DET. DUFF: April 20th.

LT. DET. MERNER: And the time is $3:10\ \mathrm{p.m.}$

Okay. Now I'll witness it, and Sergeant Duff will witness it as well.

BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

Q And just for the record, I'm Sergeant Detective Daniel Duff. It's April 20th. It's 3:03 p.m.

Besides us introducing ourselves and asking you some biological information, demograph -- I should say demographic

information, sorry, we haven't had any real conversation, correct, about --

- A Right.
- Q Basically we told you we want to talk to you about some ongoing incidents.
- A Right, right.
- Q Okay. Can you give me a piece of that?

 LT. DET. MERNER: Yeah, just take that, okay.
- And as we explained, we want to talk to you about some ongoing incidents over the past few days, that we received some information that we want to follow up by talking to you and your boyfriend.
- A Fiance.
- Q Your fiance, I'm sorry.
- A That's okay.
- Q And maybe some goings-on in and around your neighborhood --
- A Mm-hmm.
- Q -- or your building. Do you live with him there?
- A Yes, I do.
- Q Okay. So you live at his apartment building?

2		doctors' appointments, and we're planning a
3		wedding, so the wedding's in New Jersey. So I'm
4		at home once every month for about a week or
5		two. So it's like I spend half my time here
6		and half my time in New Jersey.

8	A	No, I'm not. I'm going to school in September,
9		so.
10	Q	How old are you?
11	A	25.
12	Q	And you're going to be going to school this
13		coming September?
14	A	I'm going to medical school in the Caribbean in
15		September.
16	Q	Okay. Were you working previously?
17	A	Not since before my back surgery, which was
18		2007. I've been looking for work in Boston for
19		about a year and a half now. I have not found
20		anything. I can't I can only do part-time
21		work because I have so many back problems.
22		Before that I was working at a hospital in New
23		Jersey after I graduated college, so.
24	Q	Any part-time jobs, employment, here and there?

No, okay. 1 A No. 2 And your boyfriend, what's his name? 3 Philip, P-H-I-L-I-P, Markoff, M-A-R-K-O-F-F. 4 Okay. - of town this past month, do yous talk daily?
- 18 A Yeah, we talk a few times a day.
- 19 Q Okay. And is that on the phone from the house,
- 20 cellphones?
- 21 A Usually the house phone. I usually call him
- from the house phone, and he's always at home.

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Okay. And you're not sure of the number that you text. You just have them punched into your machine?

- Okay. And as finances, how long has the financial situation been like this, where he just takes loans to basically live, since he started medical --9
 - Since he started medical school 'cause they A don't -- you know, you can't have a job while you're in medical school, basically.

 - I mean, this is how everyone lives. Either, you A know, you have rich parents who pay for your medical school or you take out loans. basically what it is.

- When you did work, what did you do for work? 23 0
- I was a medical transcriptionist in a hospital A 24

in New Jersey, and that was in 2007. 1 wasn't even for a whole year. 2 And that was where, in New Jersey? 3 Yes. 4 A You've never worked up here in Massachusetts at 5 all? 6 No, never. 7 A Okay. 8 I mean, I've been looking for jobs on Craigslist . 9 A and whatnot, but haven't found anything, haven't 10 even gotten, you know, answers from people. 11 Okay. And how about -- how about your 12 Q boyfriend? 13 He --14 A Prior to going to medical school, did he -- was 15 0 he working anywhere or --16 No, no, because he went right from college A 17 undergraduate to --18 To medical school? 19 0 -- to medical school, so he did not work in Α 20 between. 21 And where did he go to undergrad? 22 Q University of Albany, SUNY Albany. We both went 23 there. 24

1 Q And where you both went? 2 A Mm-hmm.

- 3 Q Is that where you met?
 - A Yeah.

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- 5 Q How long have you been dating?
- A It was my senior year, so I graduated in 2006, so it's been since 2005; three and a half, four years.
 - And so the rent is like 1400, food, cable, you have two vehicles. So we're talking somewhere in excess or in the area of -- I mean, would it be fair to say between 1500 and \$2,000 a month, just for basic living expenses?

0 \$79? 1 And then Yeah, they would give us the \$79 rate. 2 I mean, he has like a card at home that says, 3 you know, you get a free room each week in May, 4 you know, but I think a bunch of people get 5 that. I don't know why. 6 So you were going to stay one night for \$79? 7 Yeah. 8 A You said you were looking for work on 9 Craigslist. 10 Mm-hmm. 11 A Do you frequent Craigslist? 12 ·I haven't done it since December because I've 13 A been concentrating on getting into medical 14 schools so, I mean --15 You haven't really been looking. 16 So from this past December, and then like a year 17 A before that, I was looking. I was doing like --18 trying to find nanny jobs, stuff like that. I 19 would like e-mail people or e-mail the 20 Craigslist people, and I mean, I got maybe one 21 or two people to call me back out of hundreds. 22 And so I'm a little bit older than you, Q 23 obviously, so that Craigslist stuff is new to 24

me. How does that work? Do you apply for jobs right on Craigslist?

There's people that -- it's like -- it's like a newspaper, classified ads online. So there's people who post jobs or whatever you're looking for, housing. You go and you click whatever you want. Like, I, you know, was searching for child care or something like that or something in the medical field.

So I would go and I would -- they would either have their e-mail or there would be a Craigslist e-mail, and the Craigslist e-mail would e-mail the person, you know, your response. So I would be, like, well, I'm interested in this job; here's my resume, and they would send it to them. But nobody, like I said, nobody got back to me, maybe one or two women did, and they were like, well, you know, you're not good enough, so.

SGT. DET. DUFF: Sergeant Detective Duff for the record.

BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

- Q Have you posted your resume on Craigslist?
- A No, I didn't. No. I've sent them in e-mails to

people.

- Q Okay.
- A I haven't sent my resume to anybody in years,
 except for these like, these few women that I
 wanted to apply for nanny jobs. Like, I don't
 post it on Monster dot -- I don't post my
 resumes or anything like that.
 - Q Okay. Does anyone else visit him or live with him at all?
 - A No. I mean, I'm -- me and him, like we're together 24 hours a day. Like, there's -- 'cause during school, the professors, they put the lectures online. So technically, you don't have to go to class and sit in class. You can be at home and watch the lectures, which is what he does. So we're together all the time.

And whenever I'm at home in New Jersey, you know, this has been the longest time I've been in New Jersey this past month, and that was a month, and usually I'm just gone for a week or a few days. And when I am, I call him, and I call him on the home line and he's at home, you know. It's not like I'm calling him on his cellphone and he's, you know, somewhere --

- 1 Q All right.
- 2 A -- somewhere else.
- 3 Q So you were actually not in Quincy for the past
- 4 month?
- 5 A Right.
- 6 Q And today is the 20th of April. So when was the
- 7 last time you were in Quincy?
- 8 A My -- I think it was the 23rd, exactly. I had a
- doctor's appointment the 24th, so I think I went
- the day before, the 23rd.
- 11 Q And that's of February?
- 12 A Right.
- 13 0 March?
- 14 A February.
- 15 Q February?
- 16 A I've been gone until -- for a month. So this is
- the longest I've been gone.
- 18 Q So you've been in New Jersey since February
- 19 23rd?
- 20 A February 24th, March, April. Wait, that doesn't
- make any sense. I haven't been gone for two
- 22 months.
- 23 | Q We're April 20th today. It's April 20th today.
- 24 A Okay, okay. So I'm sorry. So I was home

February 24th maybe for a few days, and then the 1 next month, we're in March. So March, it was at 2 the end of March that I came home. 3 appointment was -- it would have been a month 4 from the 24th. So I think it was March 20th 5 when I came home to New Jersey, March 20th, and 6 then I came back now. So it was a month. sorry, the February, yes. 8 Have you experienced any more financial trouble 9 or has your fiance talked to you about 10 experiencing any more financial trouble of late? 11 Have things gotten easier? Has there been more 12 money available? 13 A No. 14 No? 15 Q No, not at all. 16 BY SGT. DET. DUFF: 17 Okay. I think I asked you, no one else lives 0 18 with you. You both basically live in that 19 apartment, correct? 20 A Right. 21 But you spend at least some portion of your time 22 in New Jersey? 23 Yeah. A 24

		Does he have any roommates or former roommates

	A	No, we never have friends over, ever. I mean,
		like, since we've moved to Boston, you know, w

like, since we've moved to Boston, you know, we don't have any group of friends that we hang out with. He has, like, a few friends from medical school which he sees, you know, very rarely.

That's it. I mean, we've never had any friends come over to our apartment, ever. Like that -- I mean, basically maybe, you know, just family members.

- Q Does your family come up to visit a lot?
- No. My -- his mother has come up once or twice.

 His father has come up a couple of times and my

 parents came up once, but other than that, if we

 were to go out with friends, we would meet them

 out in Boston somewhere and, you know, go out to

 dinner or something like that.

I mean, the money thing, I don't know why you're asking me if it has gotten easier, but it's been tough this whole time. It's been like, you know, we're living dollar to dollar

'cause they don't -- they're not going to give 1 you more money than -- he's taking out the 2 maximum amount of loans and that's, you know, 3 like we -- like, we were only going to get this 4 apartment that's at 8 Highpoint in Quincy if I 5 got a job, then I never ended up getting a job 6 'cause no one responded to me, and so it's been 7 really hard. So he's been taking out the 8 maximum amount of loans, so it's been very 9 difficult. 10 BY LT. DET. MERNER: 11 Has that added to the stress of the situation? 12 Is it, I mean, financial stress is hitting 13 everybody, but I mean --14 Yeah, I mean, not really because, I mean, you 15 A know, he's been dealing with it for two years, 16 you know. We do what we can do, and we'll --17 you know, eventually we'll have money and we'll 18 pay them back, you know. 19 BY SGT. DET. DUFF: 20 You moved into that apartment when, August --21 I think -- I think I was August. He might have 22 been the end of July. 23 And that was of '08? 24 Q

1 A Yes.

2 O Excuse me?

3 A Yeah.

4

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Q And he moved in around July of '08?

A Yes, I think that's -- the end of July. We moved in about two weeks apart from each other.

Q And when he was living in Boston in

A I don't think it was Dorchester. I think it was like South Boston or Dorchester Ave., but it wasn't Dorchester.

Q Do you know what T station was near there?

A It was the Red Line. He was like walking distance. There was like a big intersection, you know, like a four or five-way intersection and there's the Red Line right there. He lived on that --

Q Is there a Dunkin' Donuts there?

A Yes. He lived right down that street, but it was a very bad area.

21 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

22 Q Does Andrews Station sound familiar?

23 A Yeah.

24 Q So it's right near Andrews?

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Right, right there, Andrews Square. That's --1 he was like right down the street from Andrews 2 Square on that -- and he had a roommate. 3 was his roommate, Mike Green, so I don't know. 4 What does Mike do for work? 5 Mike goes to graduate school, not medical school 6 Α but like he's a Ph.D. student, so they -- he 7 goes to the same school, so that they don't have 8 They don't have jobs. I mean, he's on a job. 9 I think he actually gets paid. I think loans. 10 Ph.D. students get paid to go to school, so. 11 BY SGT. DET. DUFF: 12 Okay. And how long did he live in Andrews. 13 Square before he moved to Quincy? 14 A year. I mean, for however long he was in A 15 school for, medical school --16 And when --Q 17 -- that year before. 18 A So he started in what, '06? 19 No. He graduated undergraduate in 2007 May, and A 20 then he moved in that summer, so June, July, 21 August. I don't know when he moved in, but he 22 moved in probably August, and then he started 23 school in August of '07. 24

Okay. When he lived in Boston, did he also have Comcast, phone, Internet, data, cable, all that?

- Q Did he have the same phone number; did he take the phone number with him?
- A No, he did not, no. He got the new phone number.
- 8 Q And you got the new phone number when you moved to Quincy?
 - We weren't going to get one. We were just going to use our cellphones, but we don't get good cellphone reception in our apartment, so we ended up getting a phone a couple months I think after Comcast -- after the Internet thing.
 - Q Okay. So that would have been in --
- 16 A I'm not completely positive, but I just remember
 17 that we were just going to use our cellphones
 18 and that may have came a little bit later.
- Q And he moved in Quincy around July of '08 or August of '08 you said?

No. I think we got -- I 3 A think we have to move out by this July so I 4 think we got it, 'cause I remember he wanted it 5 as close as possible from the move-out date of his other apartment. But we do get, I mean, an 11 abundance of -- this one day, it was just 12 cellphone -- every five minutes was a different 13 cellphone number, which was very strange, and 14 I'm like, we should do something about this. 15 Shouldn't we, you know, call the Comcast or 16 something? 17 And he was like, no, don't worry about 18 it. And then the next day, nothing happened. 19 It was just like --20 How long ago was that, the last time? 0 21 I'd say about a month, a month and a half ago, a 2.2 A month ago. The last time, before I left for New 23 Jersey, yeah. 24

correct? 1 Right. MS. MCALLISTER: 2 LT. DET. MERNER: And then I asked you 3 if there had been any calls relative to massage 4 or anything like that, and you said, well, you 5 know, there were a couple of calls that people 6 started asking for massage, which, you know, is 7 kind of a strange call at one's house. 8 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. And that and the 9 nail thing, I mean. 10 LT. DET. MERNER: And the nail thing. 11 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. 12 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And then you 13 asked us basically why you're here. We told 14 you that a --15 SGT. DET. DUFF: An e-mail was sent. 16 LT. DET. MERNER: -- an e-mail was sent 17 from an IP address in your apartment, okay, to 18 set up an appointment with a masseuse at a 19 local hotel, and the timeframe of that 20 appointment coincides with these surveillance 21 photos of the individual. 22 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And who's the 23 masseuse? Is she --24

LT. DET. MERNER: That's -- that's 1 something that we'll get to the bottom -- we're 2 trying to get to the bottom of. 3 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. 4 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. But, you know, 5 at this point we showed you some surveillance 6 7 photos and you believe it looks like Phil in the photo, all right. 8 SGT. DET. DUFF: So coincidentally, 9 there's someone at this hotel at the time of 10 the appointment who looks like Phil, and it 11 appears that the appointment was made from the 12 computer in your apartment. That's kind of a 13 big coincidence, wouldn't you agree with me? 14 MS. MCALLISTER: Yes. I mean, could 15 there have been a million guys, you know, 16 17 going --I quess our question 18 LT. DET. MERNER: is, has Phil mentioned anything to you about 19 having any problems? Like, when the police 20 went to pull you over today on the highway, did 21 Phil say anything to you? 22 MS. MCALLISTER: No. He was scared to 23 death. He was like, oh, my God, what's 24

happening, what's happening, just as I was, you 1 know. 2 LT. DET. MERNER: And the last thing I'm 3 just going to show you is just a composite 4 sketch that was made up. Do you recognize that 5 individual? Does that look like anybody you 6 know? 7 MS. MCALLISTER: No. 8 LT. DET. MERNER: Doesn't look like 9 anybody? 10 MS. MCALLISTER: No. 11 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And that's a 12 composite sketch labeled LS 4/17/09. Okay. 13 So Phil has never mentioned to you that 14 he's called for any type of massage service or 15 made any e-mail accounts from any type of 16 massage service? And he's never mentioned to 17 you that he's been to any of the Boston hotels 18 such as the Marriott Copley? 19 MS. MCALLISTER: Uh-uh. 20 LT. DET. MERNER: I'm sorry, the tape 21 won't pick up. 22 MS. MCALLISTER: No, no. 23 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And when you 24

1	were pulled over today, he never mentioned

That hair looked longer, so I don't 7 know. 8 LT. DET. MERNER: Would you prefer not 9 to look at the digital pictures? 10 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. I --11 LT. DET. MERNER: You don't want to? 12 MS. MCALLISTER: No, I don't want to. 13 SGT. DET. DUFF: And just for the 14 record, some of those photos had a time on them 15 of April 14th, '09, at about a little past 16 10:00 p.m. You weren't in the Boston or Quincy 17 area at that time, were you? 18 MS. MCALLISTER: I was in New Jersey 19 last week. 20 SGT. DET. DUFF: In New Jersey. 21 MS. MCALLISTER: But I -- I can look on 22 my phone to see if there's text messages or 23 phone calls to him or the home. 24

LT. DET. MERNER: And just to kind of 1 bring Sergeant Duff's question into line, 2 you've been in New Jersey for about a month, 3 correct? 4 MS. MCALLISTER: Correct, a little bit 5 less than a month maybe. 6 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And at least 7 when you left a month ago, you never saw Phil 8 wearing those type of shoes, would that be fair 9 to say? 10 Right. MS. MCALLISTER: 11 LT. DET. MERNER: Have you noticed if he 12 has any new shoes? 13 MS. MCALLISTER: He does not have new 14 shoes. I monitor all his shoes. 15 LT. DET. MERNER: You what? 16 MS. And you also said you weren't at the 9 apartment for more or less the past month? 10 Right, but I can tell you that every single 11 A 12 night I talk to him on the home phone. LT. DET. MERNER: That's why we're here. 1 MS. MCALLISTER: Is there like a million 2 people that this could be? 'Cause this is very 3 worrisome, you know. 4 LT. DET. MERNER: I can understand your 5 6 I think -- I think, you know, one of the things that's most worrisome for us is that 7 an online e-mail was initiated from an IP 8 address in your apartment. 9 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm. 10 LT. DET. MERNER: The individual that we 11 believe that showed up to complete that online 12 massage or date is the individual in the 13 picture, and the first picture you looked at, 14 you thought he looked guite similar to Phil. 15 16 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And then --LT. DET. MERNER: So for us --17 MS. MCALLISTER: But does this have to 18 do with the masseuse? 19 LT. DET. MERNER: Yes. 20 MS. MS. MCALLISTER: That's being honest. 1 Like, I, you know, he doesn't get angry often. 2 He's not an angry person. He's a medical 3 student, you know. 4 LT. DET. MERNER: Right. And, you know, 5 sometimes things happen where, you know, the 6 intention is not to harm anybody. 7 MS. MCALLISTER: Right. 8 LT. DET. MS. MCALLISTER: I mean, because my mom was like worried. She's like, you're going up to Boston; don't be going, you know, into hotels. So that's where I know it from, so now --

LT. DET. MERNER: So I will, you know, we will try and answer questions you have.

I'll leave you my card and Sergeant Duff's card, and, you know, we'd probably like to talk to you one more time at least, and, you know, if you're willing to do that, that would be great.

SGT. DET. DUFF: I'm sure there's some

questions that we either forgot to ask you or didn't think to ask you.

MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And who is questioning him right now? Do you know or is he --

LT. DET. MERNER: I think he's finished.

MS. MCALLISTER: He's done, okay.

LT. DET. MERNER: As far as I know, but again, we're inside this room so I'm not sure.

And I'll grab you a card.

SGT. DET. DUFF: I know we introduced ourselves. I really don't expect you to remember our names. That's why I'm going to give you my card.

LT. DET. MERNER: And I'll give you one when we get out of the room.

SGT. DET. DUFF: Okay, there you go. It is 4:21 p.m. by my watch. Thanks for your time.
